




# Resources for Child Safety

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## MEDICAL VISIT CHECKLIST FOR MINORS

**For any visit that requires a doctor or hospital visit, including emergency services, the following should be ensured:**

- If applicable, administer and document first aid.
- If applicable, call an ambulance.
- Inform parents of the incident and where you are going for treatment, ask if they would like to speak with the medical professional.
- Inform relevant leadership.
- Record address/contact information of medical facility.
- Once seen by a medical professional, record name of professional.
- If applicable, call parents to connect them with the professional.
- Ask the following questions:
  - If applicable, are they contagious and if so, how long until they can room with others?
  - Do they have any physical activity restrictions?
  - Is there a need for increased rest/sleep?
  - Is there anything else we need to watch for?
  - Do they need a follow up appointment?
- Always take discharge paperwork.**
  - Including any test results such as labs, X-rays, or scans. For CTs, request a copy of the disc.
  - If it is in Hebrew, try to get an English translation.
- Photograph discharge paperwork.
- File incident report with photo of discharge paperwork or other form of maintaining documentation of the incident/actions taken.
- Update parents.
- Update relevant leadership.

### **PLEASE CALL AN AMBULANCE UNDER THE FOLLOWING CIRCUMSTANCES:**

- *Disoriented or change in mental status.*
- *Loss of consciousness or unresponsive.*
- *Severe bleeding.*
- *Major head injuries.*
- *Severe or life threatening injuries/conditions.*
- *Overdose.*
- *Seizure.*
- *Stroke.*
- *Chest pain or Heart attack.*
- *Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing.*
- *Severe allergic reaction.*
- *Severe burns.*
- *Poison or venom intake/ingestion.*
